



I want you to be 100% comfortable in your choice of me as the photographer for your wedding. Listed below are some questions that couples will sometimes forget to ask or are too shy to ask. If there is anything else you need answered, please don't hesitate.

Q. What will you be wearing to my wedding?

A. I will be wearing dress clothes just like any guest of your wedding would. My female assistant will also be professionally dressed and will conduct herself in a friendly and professional manner with your family and guests.

Q. Do you have any photography training?

A. Yes, I continually study the craft of photography and digital imaging. In the off season (winter), I always take a few classes to add new techniques to my craft. I believe that you can never stop learning. I'm a member in good standing of the Professional Photographers Association and I am insured through them. Please visit my Journal to see the consistent quality I deliver over the course of the year to many different clients. My digital darkroom training comes from the National Association of Photoshop Professionals.

Q. What kind of camera gear do you own?

A. I show up to every wedding / event with two professional camera bodies, top grade lenses, professional grade off camera flashes as well as portable studio lighting to achieve the "magazine style" quality that you see in the images.

Q. What type of payment do you take to officially book and secure you as the photographer for our wedding day?

A. I can accept all major credit cards via telephone, email or in person. Cash and check is also acceptable and a receipt is built in to the wedding photography contract. I request a 50% retainer of the package price.

Q. How do I know you are going to show up for my wedding?

A. I average 20+ weddings per year and have never missed. I intend to never miss an event. Should something unfortunate happen to me, I have family who is aware of all of my commitments and they have access to a database of professional photographers. Hopefully, this will never occur. Sadly, I do hear stories of this kind of non-professional behavior from some photographers. Rest assured, we care about you.

Q. If you are Region Weddings, then who is SBV Photography?

A. It is the same business. I simply separated my wedding work from my general photography work (kids, high school seniors, etc.) to better serve bridal couples who need to see and read about wedding photography in an all in one site. When you meet with me, you are meeting the owner and the photographer. I will be the one who shows up on your wedding day. I do not outsource the photography as many services do.

Q. After I book, what happens next?

A. We will stay in [contact via email](#) and will have one or two meetings afterwards to go over the timeline of the day and to discuss the style in which you would like me to cover your wedding. I will ask you to return a shot list back to me and we will also double check the locations to see if everything is still the same. I encourage you to subscribe to my Journal online and to follow [SBV Photography on Facebook](#) to keep up with my latest work. I'm will always be available to you to answer any questions or to brainstorm ideas.

Q. I want to book right now. How do I get things started?

A. Call or email to see if your date is still available. I can secure payment and do contracts in person or via the internet. Bookings tend to go in clusters and happen very fast. I want you to be sure of me, but please don't procrastinate too long. If your date is taken, I will be glad to help you find someone who is qualified.
